

Letter from A.P. Watt to S.R. Crockett
Penicuik

27 July 1906.

Dear Mr Crockett

I have the pleasure of informing you that I am this morning in receipt of a letter from [] in which he writes 'I have read the Crockett instalment and we should be glad if Mr Crockett would proceed with the story on the lines indicated. We should like another instalment of 10,000 words of this story, not later than September 1st.

I also take this opportunity of informing you that as a result of negotiations, I have had in hand for some little time I have just heard from Irwin that he is willing to take another story, serial and book rights at the same terms as those the RTS gave for the White plumes of Navarre. They would want to begin the serial in the November 1908 number of the Sunday at Home.
