Dear Nicoll,

Just a line to put on record that I understand that as we have now succeeded in making an arrangement for the publication of Crockett's "Galloway" (including the purchase of Pennell's illustrations at £100) in America, the suggestion put forward via yours of the 30th ultimo, that in the event of no American arrangement being made, Crockett should agree to take no money for the first edition unless a certain number of copies were sold, is withdrawn and the agreement as originally arranged between us, and covered by the letters which have passed between us, holds good except that the number of copies in the de luxe edition is at your option to be reduced from 750 to 300 copies.
